

# Covid memorial service at Oswaldtwistle

Holy Trinity Church, Oswaldtwistle, hosted a Covid Memorial Service on Sunday 20th March 2022. The date was chosen because it was the Sunday before the second anniversary of the first lockdown (23rd March 2020).

The service was for all who had lost a loved one during the pandemic and were not able to have the funeral service that they would have wished, whether they had died from Covid or from some other cause. The invitation was extended to families in Oswaldtwistle and surrounding area, irrespective of where their loved one's service had been held.

The churchwardens read out the names of nearly 40 people who had died and members of the bereaved families lit candles in their memory.

The service was conducted by Bishop John Fenwick, assisted by Mr Garry Hammond, the Reader. It was attended by local MP Sara Britcliff (who grew up at Holy Trinity) and by representatives of the police, NHS and other key workers.

The collection was divided between victims of the invasion of Ukraine and the local church.

Tea, coffee and sherry were served to the congregation afterwards.








# Charity queen still raising money for good causes



Hyndburn Borough Council have been busy planning ahead for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations this June and some of the events and activities taking place have now been announced.

A highlight of the Jubilee celebrations will be a free hop-on hop-off bus service visiting seven of Hyndburn's parks on various dates, helping people to take part in the interactive 'Beacon Trail'.

Cllr Miles Parkinson OBE, Leader of Hyndburn Borough Council said:

"I am particularly pleased that events for the Platinum Jubilee Celebrations will extend across Hyndburn and not only are we bringing the Jubilee to people's doorstep, we are also helping families explore more places in our borough too!

"There are still a few other events and activities we are awaiting to confirm so this list is going to get even longer closer to the time. I would encourage everyone to put the dates in their diaries and let their friends and family know."

# The 1921 Census for England & Wales Part 2

Do you remember completing the recent census returns and what went through your mind? Did our ancestors have the same thoughts about completing the earlier ones? For the family historian the census returns are an important source of information. The release of the 1921 census is the most recent one and we will have to wait until 2052 before the next one appears.

The 1921 census contains some interesting features. For the first time the individual's age is more accurately given in years and months and divorce is recorded. The name and address of each person's place of work is also recorded. From the information contained on the return you can also tell if any of the family's children are at a different address on the night of the census.

The census was due to be taken on 24 April 1921 but because of industrial action taking place in the country it was delayed until 19 June. It is possible that your ancestor was living in a town that had wakes weeks in June and therefore you may not find them at their home address.

As mentioned in the previous article the transcription, consisting of 2 pages, will cost £3.50 and if you are researching several families the cost can quickly increase. So, make as certain as you possibly can which household you wish to view. Also why not share the cost with cousins or other relatives who may be searching the same family. Although a transcription costs less (£2.50) it's the handwritten images that matter, rather than someone else's interpretation, where mistakes frequently occur.

National Records of Scotland are still planning to release the 1921 Scotland census during 2021 – a precise release date will be announced in the summer.

We hope you have success with this census and remember the Lancashire Family History & Heraldry Society are always here to help. Our research centre is now open again each Thursday and the first Saturday of each month 1pm – 5pm. We also have a group that meets monthly in the Hyndburn area - see our website for details.

#### **Gardening Tips for April**

- \* Heavy rains encourage slug problems. Check for slugs during rainy periods and hand pick the pests.
- For hanging baskets in cool, shady locations, use tuberous begonias, ferns, impatiens or fibrous rooted begonias in combination with trailing plants, such as English ivy.

  \* Remove old flower heads from annual bedding
- plants to keep them blooming.
- Plant annual flowers in tubs or large containers for the porch or terrace. Make sure there are holes in the container's bottom to provide good drainage.
- Remove foliage from spring bulbs after it turns yellow and begins to dry. Set out bedding plants to cover the bare spots using care not to damage the bulbs.
- \* Use bark mulch around young trees to protect them from lawn mower damage.
- \* Mid to late June is an excellent time to take softwood cuttings of shrubs to start new plants. Some shrubs, which can be propagated In this way are spirea, lilac and viburnum. When you buy nursery stock that is container grown, check the root ball and make sure it is
- not bound too tightly. A mass of circling roots will stay that way even after it is planted in the ground.



With studies showing that pandemic pet owners are more likely to face challenges with their pet's behaviour, this year's National Pet Month will focus even more heavily on education and support.

With many of us taking on new pets during lockdown and the rise in first time owners, NPM will have a strong focus on Behaviour – one of the five key welfare needs of our animal companions.

Working with leading vet and pet professionals throughout the month, NPM will share top tips and advice on Companionship, Behaviour, Diet, Health and Environment.

Latest statistics from NOAH (National Office of Animal Health) show that pandemic pet owners are more likely to face challenges with pets due to our changing lifestyles in recent years.

A study showed 27% of owners of dogs or cats acquired during the pandemic are experiencing unwanted pet behaviour, with 31 per cent even concerned they may have to give up their pet.

National Pet Month recognises this worrying trend and is working to change this by encouraging pet owners to reach out to vet and pet professionals for help.

"With three in 10 owners welcoming a new pet during the pandemic, there has never been a greater need for education and support around responsible pet ownership," says Dawn Howard, NOAH Chief Executive.

"With national lockdowns, restrictions on travel and social gatherings, loneliness has been at an all-time high, so it's no surprise people have introduced a new pet. The benefits to our mental and physical health are proven.

"However, although recognising a pet is part of the family, some owners are struggling to adapt as we return to the workplace and start more regularly socialising again. In some cases, our pets are finding themselves back in rescue or suffering from separation issues."

Dawn adds: "We need this to change. That's why NPM will be tackling important issues like separation anxiety, new owner worries and more during this year's campaign.

"We want pet owners to know there is help available and encourage them not to give up on their pet.

In many cases, there are simple steps an owner can take to improve a pet's behaviour. Sometimes just one conversation with a vet or pet professional can make a positive difference for you and your animal companion."

### A GRAND DAY OUT Part 3

– by Ellison Street

On Saturday the 16th of May 1953 to celebrate its Centenary, Accrington's largest single employer Howard & Bullough, took all its 7,000 employees to Blackpool for the day. No less than fourteen special trains were hired to depart at intervals between 08:03 and 11:25 in the morning, returning between 20:30 in the evening and 00:10 at night. Employees would be able to board at stations in Helmshore, Haslingden, Church, Rishton, Colne, Nelson, Burnley Bank Top, Rose Grove, Hapton, Huncoat, Padiham, Great Harwood, and Blackburn, as well of course, at Accrington. In the resort itself, meals would be served in 9 restaurants each with two sittings and there would be free entry into the Tower or the Winter Gardens.

Those responsible for the arrangements included Mr T. Langton the Finance Director, Mr W. Smith the Personnel Officer, with his assistant Miss J. Duxbury the Wages Cashier, Mr P. Hindle, and Councillor James Hodson the Welfare Officer, a Liberal who served for several years on the Transport Committee.

"This was the largest influx for a day trip on any one occasion, beating the previous record by 1,500", stated Mr Harry Whitby the Service Manager of British Railways, who was put in charge of all the train arrangements, especially those at Blackpool Central Station.

On returning home a fleet of buses was arranged to meet the trains to ferry the workers onward to their home towns. The total cost of this outing was estimated to be £10,000.

#### E. J. Riley, Another Famous Employer - by Ellison Street

The firm of E. J. Riley were world renowned makers of sports equipment based in Accrington. They occupied a factory just off Willows Lane called Willows Mill, where amongst other items they made the finest billiard tables. In April 1906, the occupants were tenants of the Lancashire & Yorkshire Railway Company at a rent of £20 per year. About 1,000 square yards of land to the immediate west of Willows Mill was currently used as sheds in which to season wood and as storage, which was required to be included in Riley's lease. These could now be lost to them unless the L&Y gave them permission to use it! It was resolved to grant Riley's an extension to their lease which included this land, (subject to the approval of the Railway Company) for a term of a further ten years. Some former 6-wheel passenger brake vans, which the L & Y had converted exclusively available for the firm, the weight of a 12´x 6´ table with a thick slate bed requiring a more specialised type of conveyance can be seen in this photograph, along with identifying wording. These vans were loaded at a siding adjacent to the Willow Works on Dale Street for export all around the globe.



Here they are seen behind one of the L & Y's 4-4-0 tender locomotives, built at Horwich to Aspinall's design in 1894. Normally used on passenger services, this gives some indication of just how valuable this work was to both companies. It is also seen passing a large hoarding advertising the sports equipment made by the Accrington-based firm. (Copyright not claimed)







# Five reasons why you need to update your will

Most people are aware of the need to have a will in place, but the importance of it being reviewed regularly is often overlooked.

Circumstances change and it's surprising how quickly a will can become outdated, So, if you made your will more than three years ago, then it would be wise to have a think about what has changed between then and now.

Clare Rogers, who is a wills specialist at Woodcocks Haworth and Nuttall Solicitors, explores five good reasons why you should consider updating your will.

#### 1. Your family circumstances have changed

If your will was made prior to marriage, then it is most likely the case that it is now invalid, as getting married voids any existing will. Conversely, while a divorce won't necessarily invalidate your will, it does prevent your former spouse from benefiting under the will.

Perhaps you are now cohabiting with someone, in which case you will need to think very carefully about whether you want your partner to inherit on your death as this will not automatically be the case. Becoming a parent or grandparent may also mean you want to ensure those children are provided for in your will.

#### 2. You have suffered a bereavement

If you have lost a loved one, then it's important to consider how this may impact your will. If they were named as a beneficiary, then you will need to think about whether you want their gift to go to someone else. If they have children of their own, you should bear in mind that it will not always pass automatically to them

If someone you had chosen to be an executor or guardian for your young children has died, it's vital you appoint a replacement too.

#### 3. Your assets have changed

If you have moved house or purchased another property, you should really be seeking advice on how this could impact your will.

Perhaps you have purchased property in joint names, in which case it is very important to speak to your solicitor and make sure you understand what will happen to your share of the property when you die. Or, if your wealth in general has increased or decreased significantly, then you need to consider if changes need to be made to ensure any gifts in your will remain proportionate and relevant to your assets.

#### 4. Changes to tax legislation

Tax rules are constantly changing and it's likely new policies have been introduced since you made your last will. Extra inheritance tax relief is now available if you're passing your family home on to your children,

step-children or grandchildren, although it doesn't automatically apply in every case and it's important that your will is worded in such a way to ensure the extra allowance can be claimed.

#### 5. To prevent a dispute

In cases where something has happened to make you question whether you want to remove a person from your will, you should think carefully what your reasons are for removing them and keep a record of those reasons alongside your will.

According to the Ministry of Justice, the number of contested will cases continues to rise, so if you're worried that someone might try to contest your will or you want to avoid a family dispute arising, then you should share your concerns with your solicitor who can advise how such a situation can be avoided.



Accrington's Town Centre Investment Plan (TCIP) was released in January 2022 after months of collaborative work between council officers, expert consultants, and community representatives.

Shortly after the TCIP was released people were invited to have their say and complete an informal online survey about the plans. Over 1,000 people took part, with most people being Accrington residents. Hundreds of people also left additional comments on the survey form.

Results from the consultation highlighted people would like Accrington Market Hall, The Victorian Arcade and the Arndale Centre prioritised as locations for investment or transformation. Heritage and environment are also key priorities and important themes include retail, shopping, food and entertainment facilities in the town.

Cllr Miles Parkinson OBE, Leader of Hyndburn Borough Council, said:

"The TCIP for Accrington was created over many months last year. The results of a formal opinion poll conducted in August 2021, the research, analysis and expert advice from consultants plus the steering from partnership boards including local representatives from all sectors throughout the year is what formed this fantastic 10-15 year plan.

"After being presented to elected members in full council then to cabinet for approval residents were invited to have a second say and let us know which parts of the TCIP Hyndburn Council should prioritise for incoming investment or funding opportunities."

As part of the next steps Hyndburn Borough Council will now work to secure funding and investment for the projects listed in the TCIP. The first of these funding opportunities will be the Government's Levelling Up Fund, alongside this other income streams are being explored such as Heritage Lottery Funding.

Project ideas from the TCIP will be selected over the coming years and be put forward for various opportunities that align the best, giving the highest chance of funding success.

Cllr Miles Parkinson continued:

"The results from the most recent consultation clearly tell us that people would like us to prioritise Accrington Market Hall, The Victorian Arcade and the Arndale Centre. As our Market Hall is a council-owned and managed facility we are in a fantastic position to take this project idea forward imminently and have already been working closely with architects to create proposed visions and ideas of what the wonderful venue could become.

"Our TCIP document means we are ready to bid into the Government's levelling up fund and our Market Hall is an ideal fit for this funding stream. When this bid opportunity opens, we intend to submit a proposal and I am feeling very confident in our future success.

"Hyndburn Council Officers have also been discussing options and opportunities with owners of both the Victorian Arcade and the Arndale Centre and aim to work collaboratively with both to ensure future plans meet the vision for the Town Centre."

Cllr Marlene Haworth, Leader of the Opposition for Hyndburn, said:

"I am pleased so many residents took part in the consultation and made sure their views were heard. It was fantastic to see that heritage is high on the list of priorities for investment in Accrington, as this is a key driving force of the TCIP. I also feel very strongly about the future of our wonderful Victorian Market Hall being prioritised and it was great to learn that the people of our borough agree."

Sara Britcliffe, MP for Hyndburn, said:

"I would like to thank all those who have been involved in creating this vision for the future of Accrington and when the time comes for Hyndburn to submit projects into the Government's levelling up fund, Hyndburn have my full support. I share the views of residents that shopping, retail, food and entertainment is what Accrington needs, whilst supporting and elevating the fantastic independent businesses we already have."

## Sports News



After declaring a climate emergency in 2019 significant progress has been made by Hyndburn Council, who are working towards their pledge for net-zero carbon activities by 2030 as an organisation.

Councillor Kate Walsh, Green Ambassador for Hyndburn, said:

"A huge amount of progress has been made after a 'One Carbon World Footprint' study recommended we make decarbonisation a priority, particularly combatting the gas usage in the Council's buildings. The action was taken immediately in Hyndburn and an investment of £2.3million was secured from the Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme, which is funded by the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) and is delivered by Salix Finance, to sit alongside council investment."

The works being undertaken at Hyndburn Leisure Centre alone are projected to decrease carbon emissions of the building by 75% once complete. The measures and adjustments being put in place aim to reduce the overall carbon footprint of the council and off-set carbon emissions.

Kate continued:

"I am proud to say that due to hard work and quick action this decarbonisation work is now near completion on priority buildings, predicted to be finalised this summer. Hyndburn Leisure Centre and Scaitcliffe House have both had extensive works undertaken and a full transformation of their energy infrastructure will mean a significant step forward towards the net-zero carbon pledge.

"Scaitcliffe House works are almost finished, and the Leisure Centre is well on the way to be completed by the summer. These important ongoing works may cause some disruption for customer and staff over the coming weeks. I would like to say thank you to everyone for their patience and understanding whilst contractors and partners all work as quickly as possible to get this vital transformation completed."

In addition to the investment from the Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme, £1million of council reserves was also allocated to contribute towards tackling global warming and to enable the urgent changes needed to safeguard the future.

Other climate change initiatives being undertaken by Hyndburn Borough Council include community tree and woodland programmes, progressively switching vehicle fleets to electric and procurement of green tariff electricity contracts going forward.

# Great Harwood District WI Meeting 9th March 2022

Rose Dummer gave an entertaining and varied talk on "the lots of different things that she has done with her life".

When she was twenty-five years old, she was the first female helicopter pilot in the British forces and became the first lady to go on anti-tank missiles. She talked about training to fly helicopters and flew Chipmunks and Gazelles as well as the Lynx anti – tank missile ones. After ten years she left and had four children. Nowadays there are several women helicopter pilots in the forces.

Later she took up iced cake making and won a magazine's wedding cake of the year award after spending over 300 hours on just making the flowers. Partly encouraged by TV programmes on channels 4 and 5, she made some large "extreme cakes" such as a life size Grenadier Guard, a Freddie Mercury and a suspended Boris Johnson. Becoming famous as "Rosie the cake diva "she created the 6-foot tall, 30 stone cake depicting a nurse hugging Santa which she donated to 1,200 NHS staff for their work on the coronavirus front line. As well as her TV work she is known for appearing at national cake shows.

More recently she was asked by the Charity Khalsa Aid to visit Iraq to help the Yazidis. The charity provides shelter, food and money for workers to do work on constructing the refugee camps etc. and Rose still supports it. Many of the Yazidi women were made into sex slaves by the Isis fighters and are now refugees. Rose is also a supporter of "Help for heroes".

Thinking of International Women's Day, she mentioned women that she had met that impressed her e.g., Rebecca Stevens the first woman to climb Mt. Everest and Helen Pankhurst a women's rights activist. When Helen was asked what Emmeline Pankhurst would think about women today, she said that she would say that women have still not come far enough.
