

Exciting project attracts much attention

Once known to locals as "The Fairy Caves," the coke ovens that lit the sky for the last time in 1930 were remarkably brought back to life as part of a project promoting the history of the Leeds-Liverpool Canal.

The coke ovens, which once changed the coal from nearby Aspen Colliery to coke in Oswaldtwistle in support of the local steelworks, and were made of heat resistant brick, were lit temporarily on the evenings of Friday and Saturday April 22 and 23, by way of highlighting the history of this part of the canal.

This project was courtesy of a stunning light installation by artist Jonny Godsmark. It received the full support of Hyndburn Neighbourhood Policing Team. In a message on the In The Know email alert service, Sergeant Karl Dixon was quoted as saying:

"The display was impressive and the support from locals and people further afield was fantastic. It is good to support local projects to bring people to the community."

The whole project is part of the Pennine Linear Park pilot project, which is funded by the government's Community Renewal Fund and delivered by The Super Slow Way.

The next event planned for the coke ovens is organised by Oswaldtwistle Civic Arts and will be between 1 p.m. and 3.30 p.m. on Sunday May 15th.

There will be storytelling "faeries". As people arrive they will be invited to sit inside any one of the "faerie's" houses," and listen to their story before moving on to the next house.

The stories will be suitable for children from five years upwards. In addition, there will be arts and crafts workshops using natural 'found' materials. This will be run by Louise and Liz from Create Yourself; a new local arts organisation Centre and Theatre.

Lancashire Family History & Heraldry Society

Jeffery Heseltine Bentley was born 24 September 1891, the son of Thomas and Martha Bentley and he was baptised one month later at Immanuel Church, Oswaldtwistle. Seeking a new life, he sailed from Liverpool and arrived at St Johns, Newfoundland, Canada on 12 Mar 1914. On the outbreak of the war he enlisted on 6 April 1916 and joined the Canadian Highlanders (No 690722) and saw service in France. In November 1917 he suffered a gun shot wound in the face. On 30 March 1918 whilst cleaning his rifle he accidently shot himself with the bullet passing through his left great toe which result in amputation of the toe. The army considered this to be selfinflicted. Jeff returned to Canada 14 May 1919 and was demobbed the following month. The following year he married Annie Green and he died on 21 Aug 1985 at Kirkland Lake, Ontario, Canada

From his record it is know that that Frederick was born 25 April 1899 and joined the Navy 25 April 1917 and completed 22 years' service, during which time he served on over 20 ships. HAVE II BEGT ON A CLUBSE



Omnibuses and the French Connection – by Ellison Street



A very early example of a horse-drawn saloon omnibus

Do we stop to ponder that as bus users we actually owe a debt of gratitude to the French? To illustrate we begin at the beginning that is the start of mass public road transportation. Monsieur Stanislas Baudry, formerly an army officer and medical student, owned a communal baths in the in the Richenbourg suburb of Nantes. He conveyed the prospective bathers to this establishment in horse drawn coaches but found to his dismay, people were using them as a cheap and quick way to get across town. Sometime around 1826 he decided to abandon his 'spa' and purchased two coaches to run a service that terminated near to a hat shop run by a Monsieur Omnes. The sign over this shop read 'Omnes Omnibus' and shortly afterwards the coaches themselves became known as Omnibuses. Encouraged no doubt by the success of this venture, Baudry went on to introduce his omnibuses first in Bordeaux and later Paris.

About the same time that railways were expanding, this new mode of transport for the working classes was also making an appearance in England. The railways prioritise the movement of goods, but the horse-drawn omnibus was designed exclusively for the movement of people. They differed from the stagecoach in that they had between 12 and 24 seats in an enclosed compartment that was rear loading, although the driver was still sitting outside with little cover from the weather. The motive power varied from teams of one to four and sometimes six horses.

Research suggests that the first British service was operated in 1824 by John Greenwood, a Pendleton-based toll gate keeper. This differed from the stagecoach, in that passengers could board and alight at any point along the set route from Salford into central Manchester, and return without having to make a reservation, space permitting of course. Such

was the success of his operations that several other routes were opened into the city from the suburbs.

It was a task delegated to our local Watch Committee to issue licences to prospective operators of public service vehicles, with the Chairman and Vice-Chair normally appointed to inspect, approve or reject all applications made for operations in the Borough. All licences were granted on a strict understanding that the vehicles did not carry more passengers than their licences permitted.

The very first public transport to operate locally in Accrington and district was provided by private individuals with horse-drawn omnibuses. The earliest reference to a private operator in Accrington was Edmund Riley who lived at the foot of Warner Street and operated a wagonette. In 1871 a Mr George Walmsley was operating a service between Oswaldtwistle and Accrington. In April 1872 Thomas Myers, of 41 Pitt Street Accrington, was advertising Sunday trips by omnibus from Accrington to Clitheroe. The return fares from Accrington to Whalley were 9 pence and to Clitheroe 1 shilling. The equipment and services of Mr Walmsley were taken over by the Accrington Carriage Company in 1874. The following year they commenced running services between Accrington and Blackburn in competition with the Lancashire & Yorkshire Railway Company, from a coach house and offices on Melbourne Street in Oswaldtwistle. These lasted until 1878.

By 1877 an Accrington - Oswaldtwistle service was running hourly. Fares were 2 pence to ride outside and 3 pence to ride inside the saloon. In June 1877, due to lack of support on the hourly 'bus' service, the fare to Church was reduced from 3 pence to 2 pence in order to attract more passengers. With the passage of time competition was increased on the Oswaldtwistle route, with J. Cronshaw starting a rival service in 1878. In 1880 horse bus services were connecting Blackburn with Oswaldtwistle, with one from the New Inn to Accrington that ran on Wednesdays and Sundays only. By 1881 W. Bury was also operating horse buses and wagonettes, to be joined by Joseph Edmundson on this same route during 1885. That same year complaints were made that Mr Bury's omnibuses were obstructing Edmundson's access along Whiteash Lane in Oswaldtwistle. The first horse bus war had begun!

In 1900 the Watch Committee was approached by a deputation of horsebus operators, for a permanent stand to be established where passengers could board their transports. It was resolved to grant this request, so it was decided that this would be on Dutton Street. However, one condition was that the stands would be 15 yards back from the junction with Blackburn Road and that the heads of the horses should not protrude out into the main road. It was also decreed that if there were to be any violations of this rule, then this facility would immediately close.



Great Harwood District WI Meeting 13th April 2022

Ladies remembered Lancashire and Yorkshire in the 50's and 60's when Ray Couldwell gave an entertaining talk on "Those were the days". A 50's Christmas featured artificial trees, paper chains, games compendiums and stockings containing perhaps 3d, 6d, an apple and an orange. Recollections of schooldays included wooden desks with ink wells and nib pens. Boys and girls were often segregated with girls doing cooking and sewing while the boys did woodwork. Milk was provided in small bottles, often frozen in winter. The audience were also reminded of "Nitty Nora", Cod Liver oil and Malt Extract. Food varied between Yorkshire and Lancashire there being no steak puddings in Yorkshire as in Lancashire; takeaways then were restricted to Fish and Chip shops.

Ray described what shops were like then, very different from today with little being prepacked. Then the changes in home life were detailed with refrigerators and washing machines being introduced. What life was like lighting coal fires and using tin baths and outside toilets followed.

The arrival of television with only one station and restricted broadcasting hours was recounted and with the help of the audience many programmes were recalled such as "Double your money", David Nixon and the "Lone Ranger" Other topics covered were the 50's crooners and other singers, Saturday morning cinema for children and the pirate ship radio stations.

Some old sayings finished the talk with some guesses as to their meaning e g "I'll go to the foot of our stairs".

As it was the Institute's anniversary, cream scones and cakes were then enjoyed.

Sad passing of Accrington Stanley stalwart and **Community Champion**

The sudden death of Accrington Stanley stalwart, David Keeley, brought tributes from all over the borough. David died on April 10th from a heart attack whilst playing golf and the news devastated family and friends.

David was chair of Accrington Stanley Trust and a a member of Great Harwood Golf Club, but was known in a wider capacity both as a fundraiser and in political circles.

He had previously served as a Labour Borough and County Councillor, was a long serving Justice of the Peace and was involved with the Rotary Club and many local sports clubs. He was secretary of Whinney Hill in the Accrington Football Combination for 45 years and also a keen cricketer. He was also a season ticket holder at Stanley and actually played for the club in the 1960s.

His father Walter was a prominent member of the Stanley team in the 1940s and '50s.

His daughter Michelle Keeley said in an interview with Accrington Observer:

"He didn't stop and was always on the go. He would like to think that he's made a difference to people."

David leaves behind his wife of 30 years, Winifred "Pat" Patricia Keeley, children, Michelle, Maxine and David, grandchildren Grace Wilson and step-grandson Scott,



brother Roger Keeley and his wife Joan Keeley and son Mark Sandiford, nieces Janet Trelawny and Angela Foxall, step-daughters Andrea and Elizabeth, and children-in-law Russell, Shaun, Nikki, and Marc.

David formerly worked as a methods engineer and Health and Safety Manager, but was always looking for ways to help others, often helping to man the Samaritans Helpline.

David was also a Trustee of Age Concern and was a on the Lancashire Police Authority for four years. In his cricketing days he also played as a batsman for Lowerhouse and Baxenden in the Lancashire League.

A minute's applause was observed before Accrington Stanley's Good Friday fixture at the Wham Stadium - attended by David's family - and a tribute was also paid in the Community Trust's section in the Reds' match-day programme, expressing the club's "deep sadness" at his passing.

It went on to say: "As a former Accrington Stanley Football Club player in the 1960s, and a season ticket holder, David had a keen passion for the club.

"He was the son of Accrington Stanley Hall of Fame player, Walter Keeley. David was actively involved in the local community and his experience was invaluable to the charity.

"He will forever hold a special place in our hearts. Rest in peace, David."

Acorn News editor Tracy Simmonds also added her own message for the family. Tracy said: "My condolences go out to the Keeley Family with whom I have been very close for over 50 years.

David was a pleasure to be around and will be sadly missed by everyone who knew him."
