

The tour included the chance to explore several of the iconic historic buildings around Blackburn and Darwen, such as Turton Tower and Blackburn Cathedral, which prompted us to reflect on the proud heritage right on our doorsteps here in Hyndburn.

Unfortunately, I cannot write in the great detail I would like to about every recent engagement but please know that the Mayoress and I have thoroughly enjoyed ourselves at all that we have attended. Thank you to all – Veterans in Communities, East Lancashire Hospice, Hyndburn Food Pantry, Active Cycles, Trinity Methodist Church, the Mayor of Ribble Valley, and the Mayor of Burnley – for making us so welcome at your affairs throughout April.

As the Mayoral year draws to a close, I would like to take a moment to reflect upon what has been a truly memorable year for the Mayoress and I. We have had a fantastic year filled with community, light, and laughter, attending countless engagements and seeing parts of the borough we have never seen before – even after residing here for so many years!

Without doubt, the best part of the whole year has been the ongoing chance to meet so many brilliant people who help to make this borough one that we can all be proud of. I thank everyone who continues to put their time and effort into events like the ones we have attended over the year – you remind us just how important our Hyndburn community is.

### **D-Day**



On 6th June, we will be commemorating the 80th anniversary of D-Day- the day on which Allied forces landed on the coast of France to begin Operation Overlord. The landings commenced at 6.30am and by midnight 75,000 British & Canadian and 57,000 US troops and their equipment were ashore. During that first day the allied casualties amounted to 2,500 killed and about 8,500 wounded. Some local lads were amongst those who made the supreme sacrifice on the first day.

By searching the Commonwealth War Graves website, it is possible to find three Accrington lads who were killed on D-Day. Then, by using other sources, it's possible to add a bit more detail to their brief lives.

Lance-Corporal Joseph Proud, 5th Bn East Yorkshire Regiment No 4460795, aged 24. In May 1944, he married Ethel Mildred Genevive Price in Durham. Joseph is buried at Bayeux which was the first French town of importance to be liberated.

Private Joseph Donald McNeill, 5th Bn The King's Regiment (Liverpool) No 14402192, aged 20. He was born in Accrington in 1924, the son of Archibald McNiell & Mary (nee Morgan). Joseph is buried at Hermanville, a village just behind Sword Beach which was occupied early on 6th June.

Private Arnold Hargreaves, The parachute Regiment AAC 13th (2/4th Bn The South Lancashire Regiment No 14422876, aged 20. He was born in Accrington in 1923, the son of Henry Hargreaves & Edith (nee Watkinson). Arnold is buried at Ranville, the first village to be liberated in France when the troops of the 6th Airborne Division landed nearby by parachute and glider.

If you need help researching your military ancestors we might be able to help. The Lancashire Family History & Heraldry Society's Research Centre is open, free-of-charge, each Thursday and the first Saturday of each month between 1pm and 5pm. If you need more information, check out our website.

Did you know that a baby hedgehog is called a hoglet? Did you know that hedgehogs are born without bristles? The bristles begin to appear within a couple of hours after birth and are white at first.

Thanks to Donna from "Willow top Hedgehog Rescue" Great Harwood District WI know a lot more about hedgehogs after her talk at the April Monthly Meeting.

Donna's enthusiasm and love for hedgehogs was apparent. Over half of hedgehogs have been lost from our countryside since the millennium and hedgehogs have disappeared from a third of sites in towns and cities. One of the biggest causes is the lack of natural food (insects) due to the large-scale use of pesticides by farmers.

Hedgehogs usually hibernate between November to mid-March, but they can sometimes be seen out and about during this period changing nesting sites. They are nocturnal creatures and if you see one out and, in the daytime, please do not pick it up unless it is in imminent danger. Hedgehogs are wild animals, so being handled is a stressful experience. If you are unsure, contact a specialist group such as The Wildlife Trust before trying to help

Our gardens provide a space for wildlife larger than all our National Nature Reserves, so by gardening in a wildlife-friendly way, we can help hedgehogs to survive. Hedgehogs eat insects, so try to leave an area where logs, twigs etc can be stored and insects thrive. Stop using slug pellets problem as the slugs eat the pellets and the hedgehog eats the slug!

## 100 years Past to Present

Blackburn Road was built in 1827 to alleviate the unemployment and distress caused by the power loom riots of 1826.

The Main Route through to Blackburn has always been a main shopping street. In recent years changes to the road system making it a one way system with the reopening of St James Street to traffic and the Bus Station which relocated from Peel Street in June 2016.

The Town Hall was built to commemorate Sir Robert Peel and was opened in 1858 and is now a fully functional Venue for you to get married there. The Market Hall was opened in 1869 and is one of the few Victorian market buildings in the country which is undergoing renovation with the Levelling up fund and is due to be completed in Summer 2025.

## Things That Go Bump In The Night

At twenty minutes past midnight on Tuesday 26th of September 1899, there was a thunderous crash which awoke the residents living on Lonsdale Street and the nearby dwellings. This was due to a locomotive travelling between Accrington Locomotive sidings and Church Railway Station, being put onto the wrong line, then crashing through the buffer stop. It then plunged headlong down between the two bridges carrying the line over the roadway. People flocked from their houses in darkness to see if anyone had been injured. Fortunately, there had been no one in the vicinity of the bridge at that late hour.

The luggage vans making up the stock on which this engine was rostered, had required shunting before setting off for Hellifield. Then having completed this manoeuvre, the loco had moved off to regain the adjacent running lines. When he realised the situation the driver had immediately applied the brakes, but the weight of the train had pushed through the buffers propelling it over the parapet. The tender had become detached and along with the wagons it remained upright on the track, whilst the locomotive had plummeted 15 feet down onto the road surface.


The driver stayed on the footplate so it was very lucky he did not receive any serious injuries and was able to clamber down to safety, whilst his fireman was also uninjured. He had jumped from the engine at the last second. It was extremely fortunate that the boiler of the locomotive had not exploded due to the force of the impact, after it had come to rest at a 450 angle. Both were enginemen from Wakefield Sheds and when interviewed, the driver expressed the opinion that the two bridges carrying the lines should be made into one by adding another through road. This improvement Accrington Corporation had previously refused permission for the Lancashire & Yorkshire Railway to carry out.

A brake-down crane and crew were immediately summoned, but due to the difficulty of the location and the fact that the engine, number 684 weighing 50 tons, had gone through the paving and embedded itself over a foot down in the substrata. The recovery would take until the following Sunday to complete, which involved separating the tender from the stricken engine. During this time road traffic was allowed to pass by on one side of the highway.


An investigation found that a new signal box was in the process of being constructed on the Church side of this bridge and this had significantly obstructed the view of the signalman on duty at Church East Box. It was concluded this was in part to blame for this accident.

The Aspinall 0-6-0 tender locomotive was new in February 1898 and was coupled to a Barton Wright tender. It could not have suffered too much damage as it was repaired and returned to traffic, surviving until February 1956 as British Railways number 52382 when allocated to Bury Sheds.

This was the second occasion that a locomotive had come down into the road at this location. A similar incident had occurred in April 1886, when a locomotive running light engine crashed through a buffer-stop close to Lonsdale Street Bridge also finishing nose down in the road.







The 2023/24 football season has drawn to a close with Accrington Stanley finishing in the lower half of League Two and securing their place in the football league next season which will be the nineteenth consecutive season back in the football league.

John has been assessing players in training and matches as he prepares to mould his playing squad for next season as well as considering his options to appoint an assistant. The Academy continues to go from strength to strength under the guidance of Duncan Fearnhead and many graduates feature in the first team match squad and line up with the club looking to grow it's reputation of giving young players good opportunities to experience first team football.

Our understanding of mental health and how if affects our lives is developing all the time and mental health professionals believe that being familiar with some facts and figures on the topic can help improve our understanding of just how many people struggle with mental health issues and specific disorders. Here at the OASST, we are aware of the toll mental health problems can take, and as part of our drive to help, we organise a monthly session at 1.30pm on the last Thursday of each month at the Accrington Stanley Community Trust Sports Hub on Thorneyholme Road. The sessions are entitled 'Talking Balls' and it's a chance for people to come together in a sports themed afternoon to chat about sports, take part in a quiz, maybe play a few games or just talk to people over a cup of tea and a biscuit. The sessions were initially hosted by former assistant manager Jimmy Bell, and over the past couple of months, club captain Seamus Conneelly and attacking midfielder Joe Pritchard have hosted the sessions. Joe's involvement is particularly relevant as he has spoken openly in the past about mental health issues he experienced as he was recovering from a serious long term injury.

The sessions are informal, so if you are interested, just come along as the first step is often just talking to someone else can be so important and beneficial. If you are interested in finding out more about mental health in general or getting some more information on help that's available, there are some great resources at www.mind.org.uk.



# New £200,000 3G Pitch receives planning permission at Stanley Sports Hub

Accrington Stanley Community Trust have been granted planning approval by Hyndburn Council for a new small sided 3G Football Pitch.

The pitch will be constructed at the back of the building, on land that is currently unused space within the grounds of the sports hub due to a fire access path that had to be installed to comply with building regulations.

Following a successful building regulations application for repositioning the fire access, this proposal seeks to utilise the now available space. Current demand for pitches by local groups has meant there is now a need for a mini football pitch which would fit within the now available space.

The new pitch will be used by a number of disabled groups of both children and adults, grassroots teams, community sessions for over 50's, veterans' sessions and after school provision. The community benefits of this pitch are enormous for participation in sport, and leading a healthy lifestyle.

This is a further investment of £200,000 into providing first class facilities for our local community, bringing the total investment at Stanley Sports Hub by Accrington Stanley Community Trust to £3.7m since 2020.

The construction of the pitch is due to commence in summer 2024 and available for use in September 2024.
