Hold your hand out! Grammar school 'old boys' whack out the cheques

Two youth groups in Hyndburn have each received a £500 boost from a school ex-pupils' fund for good causes.

Accrington Grammar School Old Boys' Association made the donations to Fairfield Boxing Club, Accrington, for new gloves and head guards for junior boxers, and 1st St Paul's Scout Group, Oswaldtwistle, to improve disabled access at its headquarters in Straits.

Although Accrington Grammar School's last intake of pupils was in 1975 before it went comprehensive as Moorhead High, ex-pupils still meet and hold events to top up the group's charity fund. The group invited applications for grants in its latest round of donations.

Fairfield Boxing Club began life in 2020 as a free outdoor fitness group led by husband-and-wife Scott and Annabel Parsons, from Claytonle-Moors. They found premises at a former factory in Charter Street, Accrington, and created a gym using mainly donated second-hand equipment.


Both qualified boxing coaches, they run training sessions for more than 20 boys and girls aged from just under six to 14 and some over-14s, ladies' boxing-for-fitness, and family fitness sessions.

St Paul's Cub and Scout group has upgraded its HQ at Straits, Oswaldtwistle, with new windows and roof insulation, and now aims to install a wider door and outside ramp to make it more disabledfriendly and useful for other community groups.

The group has more than 20 Cubs and Beaver Scouts and is the venue for regular first-aid training for East Lancashire Scouting, as well as playing host to Guides and Brownies.

The AGSOB committee has also agreed a £500 grant for equipment for schools' American Flag Football, a non-contact version of American football based at Mount Carmel High School, to be presented later.

Playing for kicks

It was my great pleasure to be present at the Annual Sportsman's Dinner, which this year celebrated Whinney Hill Football Club's 60th Anniversary, where the guest speaker was former England, Manchester United and Newcastle United striker, Peter Beardsley. It was held at Poplar Working men's Club in Accrington on March 28th.

Peter talked about his life and career in an interview with Andy Ashworth. He started at Carlisle United and progressed to enjoy a prolific career with Newcastle United, Liverpool and Everton, earning 59 England caps along the way and scoring 9 times for England in the process. He also represented England in two World Cups and the 1988 European Championships. After he finished playing, he became Assistant Coach for England before coaching the reserve team back at Newcastle, stepping is as first team caretaker in 2010.

He was awarded an MBE in 1995 for his services to football.

Finally, let's end on a high note! My Mayoral Charity Ball was a resounding success. The night was filled with fantastic food, wonderful company, and of course, brilliant dancing. Most importantly, we managed to raise a staggering total of £14,339.65! These vital funds will be distributed to three deserving local causes: Milly's Smiles, Jeffrey's Battle with Battens Disease, and Accrington Stanley Women. I'd like to extend a huge thank you too that attended and made the night so special, and to the sponsors and organisers of the event, without whom we would not have raised such a significant amount of money for such good causes.

Street Angels secure £3,000 Community Chest Grant

Accrington Christians Together have been awarded £3,000 from Hyndburn Borough Council's Community Chest Fund to support their town centre Street Angels project. Street Angels is a relatively new project to Accrington, and operates to reduce crime in the night time economy of and to help the police and emergency services to aid the vulnerable. They provide support by their presence in the town centre and helping people in need. This may be by providing a safe place for people to come to, a place to charge a phone, help to get home, find lost friends or provide basic first aid.

Family History Societies

Family History Societies have been in existence for many years now – we ourselves celebrated our 50th Anniversary last year and, like everything else in life, has changed drastically from how we were in 1973.

Originally the Society was known as the Rossendale Society for Genealogy and Heraldry and had 10 founders. Members began running courses in various towns to show people how to research their Family history and interest was such that other Branches were formed throughout the County.

In the early days it was necessary to actually visit Churches, record offices and Archives to search records and the Branches would organise outings to places of interest and to visit Family History Fairs in neighbouring counties. As numbers and branches grew an Annual Conference was arranged so that members could meet up together and hear visiting speakers. Later an Annual Dinner was also arranged, the Branches taking it in turn to arrange the meal and a speaker. A journal, with contributions from members, was published 4 times each year.

As popularity increased and the internet was developed we were able to access records on line via the various websites. Lancashire also opened 2 Research centres – in Chorley and Oswaldtwistle where, in addition to free on line access to available resources, members are on hand to help both beginners and seasoned researchers who have hit a "brick wall" and appreciate a helping hand. We also have many members living in other parts of Britain and further afield such as Australia, Canada and USA, who we are always available to help.

Then Covid arrived. No longer were branches able to meet or individuals pay visits and much greater use of the internet took place. Zoom enabled us to keep in touch and the Society arranged monthly meetings where we could continue to meet up, not only with local members but those in faraway places who would never otherwise be able to join in. This became so popular that it has now become a feature of our Society. In fact some branches are also following suit. It has opened up opportunities for us to hear speakers from all over the Country (and world) from the comfort of our own homes.

Branches continue to meet in person but so much more is now available to our members than could ever have been dreamt of in 1973.

Hyndburn Branch meet on the first Wednesday of the month at 6.45 for a 7pm start at the Sea Scout HQ, Harvey Street, Oswaldtwistle. Details of the Speaker and other Branch and Society events can be found on our Society website www.lfhhs.org

The scheme is volunteer led and operates on Friday and Saturday nights in Accrington town centre. Over 50 people have been supported by the Street Angels over the last few months.

Bev Wood, Volunteer Street Angel said, "This latest grant is fantastic news! It will enable us to extend our patrols and reach even more people in need. We rely on funding like this to continue our vital work, and we're grateful to the council for their support."

The initiative started in December following discussions with the local police. Seeing the impact Street Angels and similar projects make in towns and cities across the UK helped garner support for an Accrington scheme, which has attracted over 20 volunteers who help with weekend patrols.

The funding will be used to provide volunteers with uniform, equipment and first aid training.

Councillor Steven Smithson, Deputy Leader of the Council said, "The Council is committed to supporting community projects like Street Angels that play a vital role in promoting safety in our night time economy. This grant shows our dedication to investing in small projects that can have a positive impact for our residents."

Landscapes

Spring usually arrives by mid-March and the frequent sunny days provide the opportunity for an increasing range of gardening tasks. It's time to get busy preparing seed beds, sowing seed, cutting back winter shrubs and generally tidying up around the garden.

- 1. Protect New Spring Shoots from Slugs
- 2. Plant Shallots, onion sets &early potatoes
- 3. Plant Summer flowering bulbs
- 4. Lift and divide overgrow clumps of perennials
- 5. Top dress containers with fresh compost
- 6. Mow the lawn on dry days (if needed)
- Cut back cornus (dogwood) and Salix (willow) grown for colourful winter stems
- 8. Hoe and mulch weeds to keep them under control
- 9. Start feeding fish and using the pond fountain, remove pond heaters
- 10. Prune bush and climbing roses.
- 11. Continue to deadhead winter-flowering pansies and other winter bedding. Pansies will carry on into the spring and even to early summer, if attended to frequently.
- 12. Remove dirt and algae from walls, paving and patios. Pressure washers can be rented if necessary.





WHY RECALL

TRAINING MATTERS



Lancashire Canine Academy

As a responsible dog owner, it's essential to understand the significance of recall training and the implications of allowing our dogs to approach others without invitation. While it may be tempting to brush off our dog's exuberant greetings with a casual "he's friendly," it's crucial to recognise the potential risks and take proactive measures to ensure the safety and well-being of both our dogs and those they encounter.

Recall training, in essence, teaches our dogs to respond promptly to our calls, even in distracting or stimulating environments. Without this fundamental skill, our dogs may impulsively dart towards other dogs or people, potentially causing distress, fear, or even harm. Additionally, uncontrolled interactions between dogs can lead to injuries, transmission of diseases, or exacerbation of behavioural issues.

The implications extend beyond physical safety. Encounters with unrestrained dogs can evoke anxiety or discomfort in individuals, particularly those with a fear of dogs or children who may not understand how to interact safely.





A Tale Of Two Bridges

- by Ellison Street

On its climb south out of Accrington, the railway had to pass through the Woodnook suburbs a highly industrialised area of town. Constructed in 1846, the Nuttall Street Railway Bridge was one obstacle. The width of the existing passage was 15 feet including a footpath 3 feet 6 inches wide, leaving only 11 feet and 6 inches for the passage of single line traffic to go through. It was also very low in height. This became more and more of an inconvenience as public and private road transport grew. In October 1927 at a meeting of the General Works Committee, Cllr Ellis raised the subject previously discussed at the meeting of the Town Council. It was resolved the Town Clerk was to communicate with the London Midland & Scottish Railway in the first instance to ascertain whether and on what terms, they would be prepared to collaborate with the Corporation in effecting the desired improvements.

In January 1929 the Council received a letter from the LMS, stating they had no objections to the remodelling of the Woodnook Railway arch and would consider any scheme put forward by the Council, whilst requesting that the 'plan and sections' be submitted to them for approval. However, they would not be prepared to meet any of the costs of these works. In June the Borough Surveyor was asked to draw up plans along with estimates for the total cost of this scheme and submit them when completed. In July the General Works Committee met, when the Surveyor submitted schemes for the improvements to the roadway. It was then resolved that a deputation of four officials would meet with the County Surveyor and the Ministry of Transport, with regard to these proposals. In August the Committee met again, when the Town Clerk reported on correspondence with the Minister of Transport, Hore Belisha, approving plans for the widening of the bridge under the railway on Nuttall Street close to its junction with Mount Street. In it the Minister had now intimated that a grant of £9,902 equal to 75% of the estimated cost of this work would be made to the Council.

The new bridge would have a span of 36 feet with a footpath 6 feet wide on either side, leaving a 24 feet clear two-way road passage. It was also proposed that the Corporation would construct new state-of-the-art public conveniences in the vicinity of this structure as part of the scheme estimated at £13,000. Accrington brick would face the concrete abutments with a steel girder bridge to support the permanent way 23 feet above street level. This subject to the conditions set down in the Ministry's stipulations and on condition that this was completed no later than August 13th 1936. It was resolved to accept these terms and conditions, with the Town Clerk completing the necessary agreement with the Railway Company.

In August 1933 the General Works Committee met when the Borough Engineer reported he had spoken with the Divisional Road Engineer, when it emerged it would be 'some time' before grants would be available for bridge improvements, including the one carrying the lines over Nuttall Street. However, he confirmed that the scheme had been approved by the Ministry of Transport in June 1931; therefore it would be progressed as soon as was practical.

In February 1936 whilst Nuttall Street was closed for the reconstruction of the railway arch, it required the closing of the footpaths, thus causing a great inconvenience to workpeople who would have to make considerable detours to get to their employment. So an omnibus service was put on for their convenience whilst the work was underway.

Another landmark on the North Lancashire Avoiding Line was the railway bridge, which crossed Whalley Road on a steel plate bridge at Harwood Bar just above Hyndburn Bridge. This was too low for a double deck bus to pass beneath it, meaning most services running direct between Accrington, Whalley and Clitheroe, had to be operated by saloon buses, whilst most other services avoided this obstacle by diverting around Great Harwood to regain Whalley Road on the other side of the bridge. This structure was known locally as the 'Ferodo' bridge, due to the advertisement it carried for that company over a good number of years for their 'anti-fade brake linings'. It was removed in 1968 after the line closed.



Phil Kennedy from Phoenix, Arizona, USA, founded ATP in 2018, and since has gone on to become the OASST's "International Ambassador", and is also the founder of the Official Accrington Stanley Supporters Club of North America (OASSCNA).

Darren Woodhead is from Accrington and a long standing and well known supporter of the club, having authored many books on the club and its history. Darren is also the founder of the Accrington Stanley Memories Facebook page, which boasts over 1500 and is the largest independent Stanley specific group on Facebook.

Tony Robinson now lives in Ontario, Canada, however was born in Accrington and even lived on Stanley Street, the street after which the club is named in his youth. As a teenager, he first travelled to Ontario in 1967 with his family to visit his mum's extended family, and then emigrated with his parents in 1970, becoming a permanent resident. He became a Canadian citizenship in 2012 and has dual citizenship. He took on the running of the podcast and OASSCNA Facebook and Twitter pages in 2021, and gets back to Accrington as often as he can to catch up with old friends and watch a few games.

Between them, they recorded and released over 300 podcasts including comment on the on and off field happenings at the club, interviews with past and present players, coaching staff and regular features including Darren's 'Legends Series' which has covered many of the important figures from Stanley's history and Tony's 'The World Famous Rapid Fire' feature.

To widen the appeal of the club beyond North America, the trio have been instrumental in assisting the founding of new supporters groups in Ghana and Australia, and are committed to helping grow the brand Accrington Stanley to be a household name on a global level.

Accrington Stanley Community Trust Awarded £10,000 Grant from Sky Bet EFL Building Foundations Fund

Accrington Stanley Community Trust has been awarded a £10,000 grant from the Sky Bet EFL Building Foundations Fund to go towards providing first class facilities at Stanley Sports Hub
