

## A Community in mourning

Family and friends wear blue as Jay Slater is laid to rest

The Local Community Came out in Oswaldtwistle and lined the streets for the cortege to Accrington Crematorium for the Service of Jay, where then he was laid to rest.

Throughout the weeks from when Jay went missing Oswaldtwistle had Blue Ribbons on gates and lamp posts in the hope of finding Jay.

The 19 year old went missing after partying on his first holiday in Tenerife with friends. After the 4 week hunt on finding Jay, his body was discovered and was found in a ravine in the Rural de Tempo National Park.

His body was flown back to the UK. On Saturday (August 10) a celebration of Jay's life was held at Accrington Crematorium. Around 500 mourners dressed in blue to bid farewell to the apprentice bricklayer.

Funeral director Sarah Barton officiated at the service and told the congregation: "We know that Jay touched the lives of so many people, and on behalf of the family I would like to thank all those who have sent heartfelt messages and cards to them to help them get through this incredibly hard and sad time.

"I would also like to thank all those who have helped bring Jay safely back to us, family, friends, the kind offers from people in Tenerife, the police here back home and all of you for coming here today to show your love and care."

An inquest has been opened into the death of Jay Slater, who died on holiday in Tenerife. Our thoughts are with the Slater family at this sad time.

## **Mayors viewpoint:**Councillor Mike Booth

One of the delights of being the Mayor of Hyndburn is witnessing the contributions of so many people who help enrich our borough through their selfless voluntary work.

So far, the Mayoress and I have had the pleasure of meeting an increasing number of leaders in our community who create opportunities for young people to get involved in joining organisations, such as the Sea Cadets, the Police Cadets and the Army Cadets. In July, we were invited to give achievement awards to young people who took part in the Prince's Trust scheme. This wonderful scheme, operated by the Lancashire Fire and Rescue Service in Hyndburn, is a great example of community action with young people that challenges them and encourages them to consider their future aspirations. The voluntary sector is a large part of our society and there are many voluntary activities in our towns to engage in, from litter picking, community artwork, music, dance and drama festivals, and tree planting to name just a few!

Since Hyndburn Council declared a climate emergency in 2019, there has been an increasing effort by the Council and many individuals, organisations and community groups to work toward combatting climate change in and around the borough. The launch event of the Brookside Restoration project made you realise that with the partnerships between the Council, Prospects Foundation and other key local groups, great strides are being taken in our borough towards net zero by 2030. Brookside and Bury Meadow, as a biodiverse vast expanse of open moorland, woodlands and marshland, is an initiative for generations of Hyndburn residents to be proud of and enjoy.

Another testament to our fantastic green spaces and the hard work of community groups could be found at the 'Picnic in the Park' event, held at Great Harwood's Memorial Park (which received a green flag this year and has undergone upgrade works over the last 12 months). The event was well attended by residents, and it was a pleasure to hear such positive feedback for an event that had community at its heart. Thank you to all involved in organising it and I would encourage all to take a trip to see the park in all its glory.

The Mayoress and I had the pleasure of attending the Soapbox Challenge this bank holiday weekend, a popular annual event that is always guaranteed to attract the crowds. There were some formidable entries, and the organisation of the event was superb. Thank you to the Amazing Accrington team, and I'd like to extend a big congratulations to the winning entry from the Senator Group.

Finally, after chatting with many residents across events, the Mayoress and I have been highly impressed by the talents, knowledge, expertise and skills exemplified in the people of our community. As a borough, we are a forward-thinking community of good people building a better future for all of us, not to be distracted by those who would seek to create divisions in our society. We all recognise that we depend on one another in times of adversity, and it is because we have a strong sense of community that we work together.

## Every stone has a story to tell





The cemetery has been described as the best "classroom" we have for studying the local or family history of a community. A walk around Burnley Road Cemetery, Accrington, supports this view as it contains the final resting place of those people who, in one way or another, helped to develop it.

Facing the entrance to the crematorium is the memorial of Joseph Walker who was Accrington first Chief-Constable. 17 applications were received and Joseph, who was a police inspector at Bradford, was appointed on Thursday, August 11, 1881. Accrington's Borough Police Force took charge of the town from the county's police on New Year's Eve, 1881. On Wednesday, November 7, 1883, Chief Constable Walker attended the Moorfield Pit Disaster. He died a month later from erysipelas in the head. Was his cause of death connected to the pit disaster? Although Joseph Walker was only at Accrington for a short time, he was well respected and thousands attended his funeral. The Mayor established a public fund to support Walker's widow and his 7 children.

Another memorial records the death of James Henry Hargreaves, who died at St. Petersburg, Russia on September 28, 1910. He was born in 1871 and married Elizabeth Pilkington at St James, Accrington in 1902. Shortly afterwards, like other Lancashire men, he left England to work in textile mills in St Petersburg. Their son, Harold, was born in St Petersburg on 20 April 1903. Following James' death his widow and son return to England, but she did not live too long, dying in 1914 and Harold went to live with his uncle, William Kay.

These are just two stories that the memorials can tell. The Lancashire Family History & Heraldry Society has transcribed the gravestones in Burnley Road Cemetery and many others from other parts of the county. These are available to search at the Research Centre, 2 Straits, Oswaldtwistle BB5 2LU. The centre is open free of charge – Thursdays and the first Saturday of each month 1pm – 5pm. Why not come along and discover your family's stories.

The Hyndburn Branch meet every first Wednesday of the month at the Sea Scout HQ on Harvey St Oswaldtwistle at 7.45. There is usually a speaker on related topics.

## **Hyndburn Council**

welcomes Ukrainian Delegates to Progress Town Twinning Arrangements

In August the Mayor, the Leader of the Council and other members and officers from Hyndburn Council were delighted to welcome a delegation of Ukranian representatives, including Professor Mykhaylo Oros and Mrs Liudmyla Varha, who had made the journey from Ukraine to Accrington. The purpose of the meeting was to take forward the proposal, agreed last year to set up a twinning arrangement with the town of Khust in the west of Ukraine.

A number of Ukranian residents also attended and spoke warmly of the welcome and friendly support they have received from the people of Hyndburn. Professor Oros reflected that this local support mirrored the considerable support offered by the UK Government since the start of the war.

The Mayor of Hyndburn, Cllr Mike Booth, said of the visit: "It was wonderful to meet our Ukrainian guests, those visiting and those who have been resident in our Borough. I was proud – and not at all surprised - to hear from them about the warmth they have experienced from our Hyndburn community. I look forward to plans for the twinning arrangement progressing."

Leader of the Council, Cllr Munsif Dad, said: "Twinning arrangements are not only an expression of solidarity and friendship, but an opportunity to explore mutual benefits such as around economic development and trade, education, and cultural engagement. I was pleased to confirm the Council's ongoing commitment to this initiative and look forward to a report coming to our September Council meeting for us to formalise the agreement to take forward twinning between our towns, and to bring people together to work on future plans."

A formal twinning arrangement is expected to be approved later this year.

Gas Safety Week is an annual safety week to raise awareness of gas safety and the importance of taking care of your gas appliances. It is coordinated by Gas Safe Register, the official list of gas engineers who are legally allowed to work on gas.

Badly fitted and poorly serviced gas appliances can cause gas leaks, fires, explosions, and carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning. CO is a highly poisonous gas that can kill quickly and without warning, as you cannot see it, taste it, or smell it.

By taking care of your gas appliances properly and spotting the warning signs of an unsafe appliance you are taking care of your home and your loved ones. Follow these few simple steps to keep you and your family safe.

 Check for warning signs that could indicate your (or others) gas appliances are not working correctly. Signs may include lazy yellow /orange flames instead of crisp blue ones, error messages or unexpected noises from your boiler or dark and sooty stains around your gas appliance.

- Avoid blocking vents during cold spells. Vents are there to ensure your gas appliances work safely. Blocking them could prevent this.
- Never DIY on a gas appliance. If you suspect there is something wrong with your appliance or it is not working correctly, call a Gas Safe registered engineer. You can find one at GasSafeRegister.co.uk or call 0800 408 5500.
- Know the six main symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning headaches, dizziness, breathlessness, nausea, collapse, and loss of consciousness.
- Fit an audible carbon monoxide alarm and make sure your friends and relatives have one too. Check they are marked EN50291 and display the British Standards' Kitemark.
- Make sure you have your annual safety check. Gas appliances should be safety checked once a year and serviced regularly by a Gas Safe registered engineer. Tenants – make sure your landlord arranges this. Set a reminder so you don't forget at StayGasSafe.co.uk.

- Look out for your local community. You may have a friend, relative
  or neighbour who is unable to arrange their own gas safety check
  or are unaware of what they need to do to keep safe. Help them
  stay safe by ensuring that they have their appliances checked and
  serviced regularly, if they are able to do so.
- Check your engineer is qualified for the type of gas work you need doing e.g., natural gas, domestic boiler. You can find this information on the back of their Gas Safe ID card and on the Gas Safe Register website.

Many of the fuchsias which were displayed are his own cultivars and the older varieties which are rarely seen in the big shows such as Chelsea and Southport. As always one of the fuchsias which always draws a lot of interest is guite a common one called Dollar Princess. The Dollar Princes which we display is the first fuchsia Chris owned. Having seen it back in 1966 in Darwen Woolworths as an eight year old child and, being absolutely fascinated by its beauty and its form, his mum bought it for him on condition that he looked after it. He's been looking after it after since.

From that first fuchsia, Chris's collection has grown significantly and accommodating it has been a main consideration when moving house. Through his fascination with the genus he has met many interesting and dedicated horticulturalists and so, in turn, Chris has also enjoyed sharing his experience and knowledge of the history of the fuchsia as a species as well as the hybridisation, propagation and cultivation of this beautiful flowering plant.



With everyone cheering each competitor on it was a fantastic occasion organised by the #Amazing Accrington Team.



#### The history of Abbey Street, Accrington

You will be familiar with this area but did you know that over Twenty Five years ago the area consisting of Abbey Street, Black Abbey, Oak Street, Warner Street, Little Blackburn Road, Bank Street, Grange Lane, Cross Street & Church Street was named THE ABBEY GRANGE SHOPPING AREA as the sign suggests on the railings outside The Arden Pub. 



#### The history of Warner Street, Accrington

Warner Street is a Georgian street, originally built in c.1821 to house workers of the local industrialist Mr. Thomas Hargreaves and to create a safe passageway from the Abbey Street end of the town to St. James Church. The street was one of the towns earliest paved thoroughfares. Originally, the street wasn't linked to Church Street at the bottom, this came later after the River Hyndburn had been culverted. For quite a while after it was completed, the street was informally known as "New Street" but was later named Warner Street after the Lee-Warner family who owned the land it was built on. It was considered to be the best thoroughfare in the town as it was the only street properly paved. Warner Street leads from Abbey Street to Church Street and today houses a wide range of diverse and unique independent shops and businesses. Interestingly, if you look at the building numbers, they appear to have been started from the wrong end, with the low numbers at the Abbey Street end. This is because, when building work for Warner Street commenced, Abbey Street was the main market street in Accrington and so numbering started from there.

## The legacy of a great man

Frederick Albert Gatty was born in Alsace, France on September 14th 1819. He became a pioneer of new calico (cotton) dyeing techniques within the region. His work attracted the attention of Frederick Steiner, also born in Alsace not long after the Battle of Waterloo. He invited Gatty to Lancashire in 1842. They formed a partnership and Gatty became well known for his work in improving the dyeing technique of Turkey Red. He used garancin, a pigment made from the madder plant, in his patented method. The colour became known as Gatty Red.

In 1843 the firm now known as F A Gatty and Co. Limited was founded. And the process, which he had invented, was carried out at Hagg Works.

He married Mary Anne Wharton on February 7th 1855 at Pannal Church near Harrogate and the couple moved into the newly built Elmfield Hall in Accrington. The building was designed by a Mr Green, the architect who also created the Peel Institute (which is now Accrington Town Hall). Elmfield Hall was later extended and a new wing added and a classical facade to the front.

After painstaking research over the next few tears, Gatty was shown by his Indian agents at the firm samples of a colour they called "Khaki." This simply meant dust coloured in Hindustani. He was told that if he could dye such a colour, so that it wouldn't fade due to light exposure and washing, it would sell in enormous quantities. The native dyed goods were inferior and not very durable.

This genius of a man set to work and solved the problem, and in 1884 managed to take out a patent, and khaki as we know it today was born. The invention of khaki was such a success that the firm was incorporated a Limited company in 1886. From that time the dyeing of khaki, gradually ousted the dyeing of Turkey red and the printing of calico from the work done at Hagg Works.

Gatty was to have even greater success for his improvements in dyeing army uniforms with the colour khaki. This enabled him to gain a contract supplying the whole of the British army, which changed its traditional red coloured uniform to the more camouflaged khaki around the time of the Boer War. This made both the company and himself a fortune

Frederick Albert Gatty died on June 24th 1888 at the age of sixty-nine never having lived anywhere but Elmfield Hall since its purchase. He was survived by four sons and a daughter.

In the First World War, the house was equipped for wounded soldiers by the Gatty family and converted to a military hospital.


On June 26th 1920, the grounds were opened as a park by Miss M C.E Gatty. Eight years later the hall and grounds were donated by the family to Church Urban District Council with the intention of it becoming a museum and art gallery, along with £500 for maintenance of the park.

During the Second World War, the hall was used for storing civil defence equipment and in 1948 part of the building was converted into flats.

By the turn of the century, the park was plagued by anti-social behaviour and vandalism. A plan was drawn up to vastly improve the overgrown grounds. In 2007, the derelict plant nursery was partially restored by a partnership between Prospects and Incredible Edible. They brought one of the polytunnels and a greenhouse back into community use.

The bowling green was revived and an alpine rockery created. Just four years later, the hard work was recognised by the winning of the Green Apple Gold Award for sustainable regeneration. Three years after that, a Heritage Lottery Fund award of £350,000 was used to convert the front of the hall into a purpose-fashioned community use area. This is now managed by Community Solutions, a social enterprise. They run various courses (many of which are free to attend) and a very elegant community cafe that is open to all on week days.



## **Public Houses and Inquests**

### by Ellison Street

It was the practice during the nineteenth century to hold inquests into fatalities in public houses, of which there were many involving transport. On March 2nd 1867 a fire broke out under the railway viaduct over Bull Bridge, which resulted in the death of children attending Burscough's school on the second floor above a textile factory. The inquest was held at the Crown Hotel on Blackburn Road, close to the scene of this tragedy. A verdict of death by burning was given.

On May 25th 1870, an inquest was held at the Woodnook Inn on Marsden Street into the death of platelayer Thomas Barnes, who was run over by wagons at Accrington Station. Doctors Gillespie and Russell amputated his leg but he died whilst this procedure was taking place. The Coroner said "that despite attention by competent physicians, the injuries were so severe he could not be saved", verdict accidental death.

Another verdict of accidental death was recorded at an inquest held at the Crown on Jeremiah Haydock, a 'Shuntsman' in Accrington. At half past midnight on Sunday May 14th 1871, he was struck in the head by the buffer of a passing locomotive.

On Friday 6th of December 1872, John Farnworth a Bury engine driver was killed at Accrington Station. His body was taken to the Crown on Blackburn Road where the inquest was held a day later. The Coroner stated, "There was a degree of carelessness on Farnworth's part". The jury recorded a verdict of accidental death. With twenty years' service on the railways, he left a widow and eight children.

On Thursday December 30th 1873, 26 year old Edward Brierley a labourer at Metcalf's Chemical Works, was taking a shortcut when he was hit by a train never regaining consciousness. Presided over by Coroner Hargreaves this inquest was held at the Britannia Hotel on Nuttall Street. On hearing the evidence he recorded a verdict of accidental death.

Robert Marriott, a Line Inspector with the Lancashire & Yorkshire Railway, was killed at Accrington Station on Saturday 27th of February 1875. This inquest was held at the Derby Hotel on St. James Street, where his body had been taken. Following witness statements another verdict of accidental death was recorded.

On Friday 16th of November 1877, another inquest was held at the Crown into the death of 22 year old fireman John Broadley. The Foreman of the Jury, John Royston, returning a verdict of accidental death said, "This was by no means the first accident of this kind to occur in Accrington".

On Wednesday December 18th 1878, another inquest was held at the Royal Hotel on Blackburn Road before C. H. Beck, the Deputy Coroner into the death of William Ainsworth, also a fireman on the L&Y.

In February 1880, a horrific accident took place at Rishton Station on the evening of Friday the 6th, when William Hindle was struck by the Liverpool express as he crossed the lines. His remains were recovered and taken to the nearby Rishton

Arms Hotel to await an inquest. The Coroner recorded a verdict of accidental death. Hindle left a widow and five children, but was insured in the sum of £1,000 by the Railway Accident Insurance Company.

On Friday October 19th 1883, 13-year-old Messenger John Phillips was hit by a train whilst delivering a message from the station's telegraph office to the engine sheds. On Monday 22nd at Rawson's Hope & Anchor Hotel, around the corner from Marquis Street where the deceased lived with his widowed mother, Coroner Robinson opened an Inquest into his death with Stationmaster Samuel Crossley in attendance. The driver of the 5:20pm to Rishton was running at about 20mph when he saw the boy 25 yards away walking along the line. He gave a blast on the locos whistle which was still sounding as the engine struck the deceased. Richard Frankland, signal fitter's labourer making his way from the sheds, alerted by the sound of the whistle shouted a warning and saw the whole thing unfold. He ran to him and saw he was dead. He added, "He was walking on the ends of the sleepers, when there was room away from the tracks". Crossley confirmed the only way to convey messages between the station and the sheds was by sending someone along the permanent way. He stated some days up to eight messengers made this walk, but this was the first occasion that an accident had happened. The Coroner asked, "Was the boy deaf?" to which Crossley replied, "I don't know, for he had only been on this job for eight weeks, but like all staff Phillips was warned about the dangers". In recording a verdict of 'Accidental Death', Mr Robinson said "the Railway should find a safer means of conveying messages, but in this instance it was too late". The Company sent its sincerest condolences to his mother.

By April 1895, inquests were being held in the Courtroom of Accrington Town Hall.







## Announces New £20,000 Cabinet Action Fund

The Accrington Stanley Community Trust have been awarded a £100,000 grant from the Sky Bet EFL Building Foundations Fund for the newlyconstructed 3G pitch at the Stanley Sports Hub, meaning more groups of every age and ability can now use the excellent facilities!
